Shall the Board of Education of School District No. 11, El Paso County, Colorado, be suthorized to contract indebtedness by leaving one or more series of general obligation bonds or by entering into one or more iong-term lease purchase agreements in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$40,000,000 for the purposes of defraying, in whole or in part, the cost of acquiring or purchasing buildings or grounds; enlarging, improving, remodeling, repairing or making additions to school buildings (including removal of asbestos); constructing or erecting achool buildings, equipping or furnishing school buildings as permitted by law; and improving school grounds, together with all necessary incidental and appurtenant properties, facilities, equipment and costs, such indebtedness to bear interest at a net effective interest rate not exceeding nine and one-half percent (9 1/2%) per annum, to mature, in the case of general obligation bonds, over such period of time not exceeding 20 years from their date or respective dates and to be caliable for redemption or prepayable, with or without a premium, in accordance with law, as may be determined by the Board of Education?
