# Driver's License Services Update

- Services added in 2015
  - Motor Vehicle Records
  - Youth Replacement Licenses
  - Motorcycle Endorsements
- New services by the numbers
  - 6,096 total transactions
    - 4,414 MVRs
    - 1,037 Youth Replacement Licenses
    - 645 Motorcycle Endorsements
  - **Total Revenue-\$30,480**

# Motor Vehicle Update

- 639,955 motor vehicles, up 54,645 or 9% since last staff increase

# Motor Vehicle Improvements

- Piloting new renewal card
  - December 10% fewer walk-in customers at Powers since launch
- Adding personnel to Phone banks
- Q-flow key pads – savings \$3,700/yr

# Recording Update

- Recordings -141,381 up 16% from 2014
- Home sales up 15% for Q4 and 18% for the year
- General fund revenue for Recording 4,396,523 up 21% from 2014
- Marriages -1,402 for Q4 and 6,326 for the year, up 1.2%

# Elections

## 2015 Coordinated Election

- Voter turnout in 2015 was 145,760, a slight decrease from 2013
- Election cost billed to jurisdictions was \$697,841.74

## Uniform Voting System

- Secretary of State selected Dominion Voting System as sole voting system provider
- Current ES&S system could last another 4-6 years



# Elections

- March 1: Democratic and Republican Party Precinct  
Caucuses
  - Democratic County Assembly is March 12, State Assembly is April 16
  - Republican County Assembly is March 28, State Assembly is April 9
- June 28: Primary Election
- November 8: General Election
  - Ballots mailed approximately October 17
  - VSPCs open October 24

# Precinct Resolution

- State law requires precincts to have between 1,500 and 2,000 active registered voters
- Precincts can only have more than 1,500 active registered voters if we obtain BOCC approval
- A small number of precincts are approaching the 2,000 voter mark despite last year's reprecincting
- Proposing no changes at this time
