- Democratic-34,404 (40.2%)
- Republican-72,605 (45.1 %)
- Unaffiliated-33,787 (21.9%)

# Military & Overseas Voters

We work to ensure that military and overseas voters are able to vote as efficiently as possible from far away locations. These voters are called "UOCAVA" voters, termed by the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA). This special class of voters includes men and women serving in the armed forces, their dependents, and others whose circumstances take them out of the country.

- UOCAVA Ballots mailed to 1445 voters, emailed to 2568 voters, 156 ballots undeliverable
- Ballots Returned-364 (deadline is July, 5)

# Election Timeline

- Risk-limiting audit- July 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>
  - Two Risk Limiting audits
    - Republican Sheriff Contest
    - Democratic Attorney General Contest
- Canvas-Before July 18<sup>th</sup> (Likely July 9<sup>th</sup>/July 10<sup>th</sup>)
- July 24<sup>th</sup> – last day to request a recount
- August 2<sup>nd</sup> –last day to complete a recount  
Public can inspect the ballots

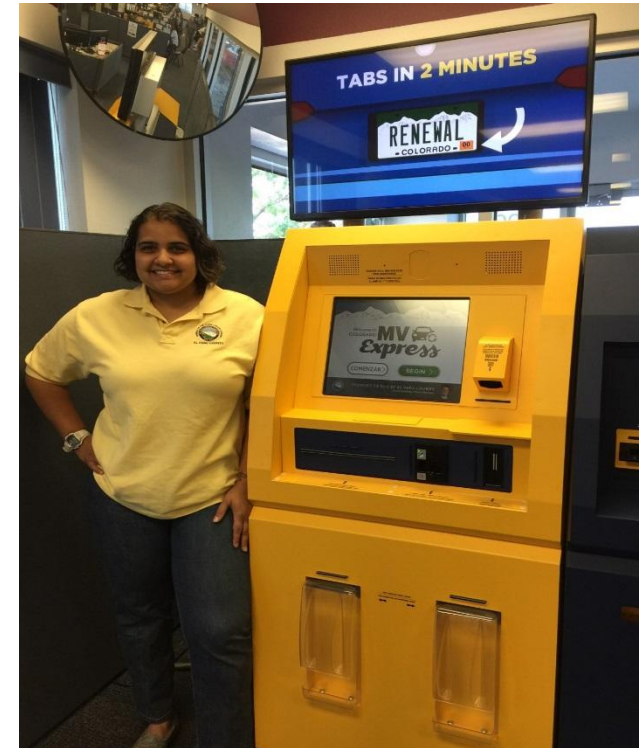
