RECALL PETITION COMMITTEE STATEMENT:

The citizens of the Woodmen Hills Metropolitan District are filing this recall petition against Janice L. Pizzi for refusing to respond to repeated requests to deal with the following Covenants, Salaries and other financial related matters as spelled out in this petition. Janice Pizzi fully supports this districts current involvement in a civil action now pending in the 4th District Court over forced placed covenants.

District residents recognize the need to be more responsible with our finances (Your Money). Mrs. Pizzi promised to bring down the cost of salaries (now she refuses to). She voted to LEASE PURCHACE a 150,000+ dollar vacuum truck which the district didn't need. Just voted to purchase 4 new trucks cost 85,000 dollars.

Janice L. Pizzi has demonstrated her lack of commitment to this community by supporting poor decisions on these matters. She has also demonstrated poor decision making by refusing to address these matters during recent board meetings. The citizens of this District have lost confidence in Janice Pizzi's ability to make sound decisions and ask for an election to remove her from office.

JANICE L. PIZZI STATEMENT:

Vote "NO" For the Recall

I have been on the board since May 2008. Three new Board members were appointed in December, we are still a new board. During that time, I have been involved with several issues that need to be clarified:

Larry, hired January 2008, is responsible for wastewater for almost 4300 homes & water for about ½ of these. If we prorate his salary over these homes, each of us pays about 8 cents per day to ensure the water is always on & the sewers continue to work.

Vac - Truck I believe the lease of the truck was cost effective. The truck is performing 3 functions:

- 1) Clean sediment from sewer pipes. (Preventive)
- Pump out overflows. (Problem response)
- Cut tree roots that grow into pipes. (Preventive)

Debt Reduction We need to ensure all tap fees in the future are spent first on paying off our indebtedness. We have been negotiating with the bondholders to defer payments so that we save over \$1m/year for the next 6 years, allowing time for the fees to accrue.

No one believes we have well written covenants. They were written by the developer and are hard to change. That said, Parkside, Courtyard and Filing #11, being HOAs, are completely separate from WHMD. We have absolutely no involvement with them. For filings 1 - 10 (except 7) WHMD has authorized WHCMB to manage their covenants. If people want to help, I encourage you

to attend the covenant management board meetings.
I arrived in September of 03 and immediately got involved in my community, I want Woodmen Hills to be the best community around and when people want to buy a new home they will think of us first. That insures stability.

The last day to apply for a mail-in ballot is Friday, August 21, 2009 if you do so in person. ATTENTION: IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

If you vote at your polling place on Election Day, you MUST present one of the following forms of identification:

- A current and valid Colorado Driver's License
- A valid identification card issued by the Department of Revenue in accordance with the requirements of Part 3, Article 2, Title 42, C.R.S.
- A valid United States Passport
- A valid employee identification card with a photograph of the eligible elector issued by any branch, department, agency, or entity of the United States government of this state, or by any county, municipality, board, authority, or other political subdivision of this state
- A valid pilot's license issued by the Federal Aviation Administration or other authorized agency of the United States
- A valid United States military identification card with photograph of the eligible elector
- A copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other
 government document that shows the name and address of the elector. (A cable bill, a
 telephone bill, documentation from a public institution of higher education in Colorado
 containing at least the name, date of birth and legal residence address of the student elector,
 a paycheck from a government institution, or Certificate of Degree of Indian or Alaskan Native
 Blood are sufficient forms of identification)
- A valid Medicare or Medicaid card issued by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services
- A certified copy of a U.S. birth certificate for the elector issued in the United States
- Certified documentation of naturalization; or
- A valid Student Identification Card with a photograph of the eligible elector issued by an institute of higher education in Colorado
